This manual is for the network administrator or operator who installs, configures, verifies, and uses the Network Data Collector tool. The network administrator or operator should have the following skills:

Usage Online Help

Network Data Collector ships with an online help system that provides overview, related information, procedures, and glossary data for Network Data Collector. Use the help system to get information about using the Network Data Collector interface and navigating within the product. You access the Network Data Collector online help system in two ways:

- Click the Help button in the Network Data Collector navigation tree.
- From any Network Data Collector dialog box, click the Help button.

You can access help information in any of the following ways:

- From a window with a Help menu.
- From a dialog box with a Help button, click the button to get information related to using that dialog box.

Cisco Connection Online

Cisco Connection Online (CCO) is Cisco Systems' primary, real-time support channel. Maintenance customers and partners can self-register on CCO to obtain additional information and services.

Available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, CCO provides a wealth of standard and valueadded services to Cisco's customers and business partners.
