Introduction

Welcome to *Cisco Centri Firewall Installation Guide*. The Cisco Centri Firewall install process involves preparing the target firewall server and installing the Cisco Centri Firewall software. This guide provides detailed instructions for both of these tasks. It provides the following information:

- the system requirements and correct network and system settings for the target computer, whether it is a firewall server and a remote administrative computer;
- what you should know before beginning the install process; and
- step-by-step procedures for installing Cisco Centri Firewall.

Because the decisions you make during installation affect how you will configure the firewall, you should read this guide carefully before starting the install process.

Who Should Read This Guide

This guide is intended for the network administrator who has read the *Securing Your Network with the Cisco Centri Firewall* guide and is ready to install and begin configuring Cisco Centri Firewall.
